

"Really focus and revise hard for the mock exams and not write them off, as that will really set you up for GCSE success. You will be surprised at how much you remember if you work hard for your mocks and how much this will enable you to achieve success." - Charlotte Kenyon

"Grasp every opportunity given to you, not only is this a year where you will be studying hard for your GCSEs, but it is also a year where you will be considering what career you may pursue. Start your revising early - ingraining this into your routine from the start will make it a much easier process, and less overwhelming." – Maisie Banks

"Make the most of your time at Westholme by getting involved in the different clubs and productions available. Join in the lunch time revision clubs that are there to help you and ask teachers for help if you're unsure about something. Lastly enjoy yourselves and don't stress. If you're relaxed and having fun, you will do well." — Ibrahim Ismail

"It is important to start studying early so that you don't have to panic closer to the exams, and to find a revision style that works for you. However, it is also important to maintain a work/life balance and make time to do things you love." – Eve Hames-Clarke

"My advice would be to still enjoy yourself but now is the time to put all your effort into your school work, especially asking for extra work when possible as the teachers will always be there to support you. Make sure you end the year knowing you have put all of your effort into achieving your results."
