A huge congratulations to all our INSPIRED students! We commend our Centenary A Level students on their fantastic achievements today, especially as this was their first time through a public examination series having not sat GCSEs in the usual way due to the pandemic.

With the conscious decision to dramatically deflate grades nationally this year, we are thrilled to report that at Westholme, nearly a quarter of our students achieved at least 2 A*/A grades and over a third achieved grade A or above.

Our count of A*/A grades at Westholme this year is nearly double that compared with our 2019 results. As the A Level grade boundaries have returned to those more akin to 2019, we are delighted with this dramatic increase in Westholme's top grades. This is a testament to the dynamic teaching and our incredible staff who inspire our students every day. I would like to thank all the teaching staff for their unparalleled commitment and dedication, going over and above as always, to ensure our students achieve the brilliant grades they wholeheartedly deserve.

Westholme has been shortlisted again for Independent School of the Year owing to our unrivalled holistic excellence. 


Edward hits all the right notes
